- Applegate Apartments -- 16 unit multi-family affordable housing in Cottage Grove.
- Aquarius Apartments--26 unit, multi-family affordable housing in Springfield,.
- Group Homes--32 group homes, located throughout Oregon.
- Mainstream Apartments-- 10 units in Eugene for people with developmental disabilities
- On Your Own-- 6 units in Gresham for people with developmental disabilities

The Emerald Options program offers housing to homeless individuals with developmental disabilities and their families. The program provides subsidized rent and ongoing support to work on issues that have caused prior homelessness. The goals for all participants are to maintain permanent housing, increase independence and self determination. An individualized Support Plan is developed with each participant to address their unique challenges, needs and desires.
